ARLINGTON

BETHEL

Starting Tuesday, March 17, free meals will be available to ANYONE ages 1-18 through the end of the statewide school closure. These "grab and go" meals will include both lunch and breakfast for the following morning. We'll be utilizing "curbside pick-up" to maintain social distancing, so you won't have to get out of your car to pick up the meals. Students do need to be in the car for parents/quardians to pick up meals for them. Walk-ups are also welcome. Again, children must be present to pick up their meals. Please maintain 3-6 feet between families standing in line. Meals must be taken home to eat. There will be no place to eat at the meal site. If you are planning to drop by one of our free meal sites, please click the dates on the website (https://www.bethelsd.org/meals) and let us know what site you'll be coming to and how many kids you'll have with you. This information will help with our planning. Orders must be placed before 8 a.m. on the day of. Delivery options are currently limited to those who have no transportation to a meal service location. EDMONDS

The Food and Nutrition Department plans to continue to provide meals to all children during school closures. Any child can go to at any location. EVERETT

Meal pick-up and order process: Meals will be available for pick up at 28 sites (times listed on form for each site as they may differ). Lunch orders must be placed between the hours of 2:00 p.m and 11:30 p.m. the day prior to meal service. Preorder is encouraged each day. Additional meals will be available for students that drop in but availability will be limited. Meals will be free for all children 1-18 years of age (they do not need to be a student). Students must be present to receive their meal. Adult meals are not available for purchase. Breakfast for the next morning will be given out with lunch. Meals will be available for pick up based on the delivery location selected on the pre-order form. Pick-up site does not need to be the students home school, you can select the most convenient site for your family. If your situation does not allow you to travel to any of the sites, then delivery might be possible. Please use the Meal Home Delivery form to request home delivery. A new form would need to be filled out each day for each student.

LAKE WASHINGTON

Meals can be preordered each day, however if you miss the order window you may come by any of the six middle school pick up sites and get a meal. Meal orders will be accepted from 2:00 p.m. the previous day until 8:00 a.m. the day of the pickup. Meals must be picked up between 10:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Students must be present to claim their meal. Students do not need to qualify for free or reduced meals to receive a meal, and no forms or registration are required.

SEATTLE

Starting Monday, March 16, student meal distribution began at 26 school sites across the city. Student meal sites will operate from 11 a.m. until 1 p.m., Monday through Friday. Grab and go meals are available for students, but students cannot stay at the school to eat them because of social distancing guidance from state and local health agencies. If you need accessibility support, staff are available to provide access to another entrance or bring the food outside.

School District meals will be provided to all students 18 and under for FREE each weekday. Meals can be picked up at Shoreline Schools Central Kitchen (located inside Hamlin Park off 15th Ave. NE, directions HERE) and Shorewood High School (17300 Fremont Ave. N.) each weekday from 11:30 am-12:30 pm. Students must be present to receive meals. Students will receive their choice of a hot or cold lunch and a breakfast pack for the following day. Each day's menu will be posted on the Food and Nutrition Services webpage that morning.

Other Food Items & Grocery/Gas Cards:

The <u>Shoreline PTA Council</u> is coordinating the distribution of grocery/gas gift cards and shelf-stable food (e.g. rice, beans, pasta, peanut butter, cereal, granola bars, canned vegetables or fruit).

These items are provided by community donations and can be picked up at Central Kitchen (located inside Hamlin Park off 15th Ave. NE, directions HERE) on March 17, 19, 24 and 26 from 11:30 am-12:30 pm.
